

South Bersted CofE Primary School's Sports Premium Proposals

PROPOSALS FOR 2018-19:

Aims for 2018/19:

- 1) To continue to maintain Silver School Games mark. Meet with SGO to begin to work towards Gold.
- 2) Gymnastics and dance CPD linked to topics.
- 3) Implementation of indoor athletics.
- 4) Outdoor education training and implementation.
- 5) Provide competitive lunch times.
- 6) To engage pupils in daily physical activity
- 7) Provide 3 Intra school events throughout the year.
- 8) Increase the number of pupils achieving the Key Stage 2 expectations for swimming 25m.
- 9) Any additional money to be used for playground resurfacing.

How the impact will be measured:

- Silver Mark accreditation in the 2018/2019 academic year will be maintained and an application for Gold will be completed.
- Staff will be able to explain how team teaching and CPD has extended their skills/knowledge and apply these in lessons.
- Pupils will be able to articulate links made to their topics.
- Lessons will show that teachers are using a wide range of resources and have an understanding of progression of key skills.
- Pupils will be able to apply the skills taught through indoor athletics to the summer term and competitive events. This will also develop pupils' resilience and development of a 'Growth Mindset.'
- Pupils will develop their resilience and communication skills.
- Children will continue to compete or participate in a range of inter school events and deepen their experiences and interest in a range of sports.
- Pupils across Key Stages 1 and 2 use the school's Golden Mile.
- Sporting opportunities and competitive events will be visible at lunchtime and the children will be taking part in these.
- An increase of the number of pupils achieving the expected standard increase from 56% to at least 70%.
- Pupils will feel safer at break and lunch times.

How the spending is sustainable:

- The CPD sessions, that both teachers and TAs have attended, provide inspiration and planning resources for activities that will be implemented and developed in future years.
- Children who have attended inter school events will have experienced new sports and will be inspired to continue playing, either through school or, by joining an out of school club.
- Continue to provide a range of extracurricular sports so that a range of children are gaining new experiences, which encourage them to continue to be involved in sport in the future.
- Monitor which children are involved in sports/clubs/events and ensure that a range of children are targeted and given the opportunities to take part and gain new experiences.
- Develop pupils' emotional wellbeing, which has a positive impact on their attitude towards sport.
- Resources will be purchased to implement Forest Schools.
- Member of existing staff will be trained to facilitate Forest Schools within the school's grounds.
- Pupils will leave the school being confident and competent swimmers being encouraged to continue swimming outside of school.
- Improved playground provides greater opportunity for pupils to be safe and active at break and lunchtimes.
