



## Admissions - key dates

### • Monday 7 September 2020

Information on how to apply online will be sent to all parents of children living in West Sussex whose child attends a West Sussex state-funded school.

Online applications open. You must provide an email address to apply.

Schools will have their prospectuses available and will have arranged open events.

### • Saturday 31 October 2020

National closing date for secondary transfer applications.

You must submit your completed application by this date. Failure to do so will affect the priority attached to your application.

### • Monday 1 March 2021

Applicants will be notified which school their child is offered by e-mail, where an e-mail address is supplied.

## Making an online application

To make an application using the online system you will need:

- an email address; and
- to create a User ID and password.

Your **User ID** must be between 6 and 16 characters long and must contain only letters or numbers (i.e., do not use special characters).

Your **password** must adhere to the following rules. It must:

- be at least 8 characters long;
- have at least one character that is UPPERCASE;
- have at least one character that is lowercase;
- have at least one special character (such as: \* ! \$); and
- have at least one number.

You may want to write your User ID and password below for reference.

## How to apply

You need to apply online for your child's school place by visiting [www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions)

Please be aware that the email address which you provide will be shared with the allocated school, as parents and schools increasingly communicate electronically.

If you do not have access to the internet, free access to apply for a school place is available in all West Sussex libraries and Children and Family Centres.

The website provides information needed for completing your application, including details of all the schools in West Sussex, your catchment school and important information for parents. Please read it carefully before making your application.

There are some benefits to applying online and we strongly advise all parents to do so. However, if you really can't access the internet you can obtain a paper form by calling **03330 142 903**.

Please note, you must provide a valid e-mail address with your application in order to receive the outcome of your school offer.

## Important information

### You must apply on time

It is very important that you apply before the closing date of Saturday 31 October 2020.

If your application is received after the closing date of Saturday 31 October 2020 your chance of securing a place at one of your preference schools could be seriously affected.

Applications received after the closing date of Saturday 31 October 2020 are late applications and will only be considered after all those that were received on time.

It is your responsibility as a parent to ensure that your application is received by The Pupil Admission Team on time.



### Your preferences

We advise all parents to think very carefully about their three preferences and to use them wisely.

School places are allocated according to the published oversubscription criteria for that school. This can include criteria such as whether you live in the catchment area, whether there are siblings already at the school and the distance you live from the school.

Please be realistic in your preferences. You have a higher priority for local schools. If you chose an oversubscribed school, the further away you live the less likely you are to be offered a place.

Please note that personal circumstances, such as working arrangements, are not part of the oversubscription criteria for any school and will not be taken into consideration.

Finally, we always advise parents to include their catchment school as one of their three preferences.
