Dear Parents and Carers

As I am sure you will have seen from this week's news, there have been many discussions about the reopening of schools. There continues to be many meetings, discussions and documentation that is being published to ensure protective measures are put in place to reduce the risk of transmission as more children and staff come back to school.

I was planning to write to you with our initial plans regarding a phased return, but have made the decsion to wait until the governments and local authority's guidance and discussions have been finalised. I realise that this may cause you to worry as you want to know our approach as a school as soon as possible, but we do not want to send out documentation until we have clarity.

I would like to thank those parents that I have spoken to for their honesty in their views on sending their child(ren) back to school. I really do feel fortunate to work with such a supportive community.

New Routines:

As more children are now attending school, we are putting in place a one way system. From Monday, when arriving please enter the school via the main school entrance in Church Lane and use the footpath (<u>not</u> the car park). Children can then walk into their designated areas. Notices have been placed on the paths as a reminder. Please then leave via Orchard Way only. **Only <u>one</u> adult is permitted to attend school to drop off or collect children at any time.**

In addition to this, there will now be different drop off and collection points for pupils. For those chldren currently attending school they will be collected from different classrooms:

EYFS and Year 1:	EYFS entrance and exit door.
Years 2, 3 and 4:	From the steps of the Year 4 classroom.
Years 5 and 6:	KS2 entrance.

Over half term, the school will remain open to children of key workers and vulnerable pupils. To ensure that all members of staff have a weeks holiday, there will be a change to your child(ren)'s learning at home over the next two weeks. Learning from Home:

To ensure that all members of staff receive their weeks holiday, there will be a change to home learning for all year groups.

For the week beginning 18th May, teachers in EYFS, Year 4 and Year 5 will be on holiday. To support continued learning at home, these teachers will post a grid of activities for your child to complete at home. This grid will follow the same format as the Easter grid. For the week of 25th May, these teachers will then revert back to their daily posts.

For the week beginning 25th May, teachers in Years 1, 2, 3 and 6 will be on holiday. To support continued learning at home, these teachers will post a grid of activities for your child to complete at home. This grid will follow the same format as the Easter grid.

Whilst teachers are on their weeks holiday, please contact myself or Mrs Bush if you have any questions regards your child(ren)'s learning.

This then means, that over the next two weeks, the foundation subject will be PSHE. The PSHE lessons will focus on children's feelings and then progress onto our special people and how relationships may be impacted during this time. The class teacher will provide resources to support with this but it will be an opportunity for you to have further scaffolded conversations with children which will help them to manage their feelings at this time. 
'True Colours' Video:


Thank you to everyone who sent in clips for the True Colours video. The final video will be shared with you in the coming days.


Reading Recommendations:


