As we approach Christmas and a New Year, there is much to reflect on. 2020 has certainly been a year that none of us will forget. Over the past week, we have maintained many of our Christmas Traditions: EYFS and Key Stage 1, Nativity, which can be viewed on the Class Pages section of the website, making our Christmas tree decorations and our Christmas jumper day. On Wednesday, pupils across the school enjoyed their Christmas lunch and our Junior Governors led our Christingle Worship. The main theme of the worship was allowing your light to shine for others. During the worship the children shared the Salvation Army video, which can be viewed on the school's Facebook page, along with the below Bible passage:

Matthew 5:14-16 states:

'You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. School Development:

During the Autumn Term, we have implemented a range of new approaches: Accelerated Reader, a new maths approach in Key Stage 2, Google Classroom and blended learning including new approaches to Home Learning.

I have been delighted with the children's responses to each of these approaches. Over the past term, pupils in Key Stage 2 have read an incredible **2070** books!

Over the Christmas Holiday, if pupils wish to quiz, they can access the school's **Accelerated Reader** ULR through the school <u>website</u>. Congratulations to all of the children who received their certificates for achieving their targets!

Again, I would like to thank for you as parents and carers for supporting these approaches. During the Spring Term, we will embed these approaches whilst we continue to develop a broad and balanced curriculum by evaluating and further improving our provision in computing and music.

Times Tables Rock Stars:

We have set a Christmas Times Table Rock Stars challenge which will run over the next 2 weeks. All Key Stage 2 children will compete against each other to see who can be the highest scorer across KS2. The results from the challenge will be announced in the newsletter in early January.

The latest challenge will begin at **3.30pm on Friday 18th December** and will run until 9.00am on Friday 8th January 2021.

Home Learning:

Over the Christmas holidays, we are proving a number of opportunities for your child to continue learning. In Key Stage 1, we are setting pupils the challenge of learning the days of the week, months of the year and the four seasons. A prompt for this will be uploaded to your child's Class Dojo page.

In Key Stage 2, pupils have been set the challenge of learning to tell the time on an analogue clock, for those who cannot already do this. Mr Wilson has uploaded a video to Class Dojo and pupils will be bringing home a teaching clock to support with this.

In addition to the above, we have also set a Times Table Rockstars battle and a Numbots challenge for the holidays. Both challenges will end on 8th January.

As stated above, pupils in Key Stage 2, will also be able to access Accelerated Reader through the school's website.
