Remote learning

Firstly, I hope that this update finds you and your families safe during this unsettling time. Secondly, I would like to thank you for your quick responses to our recent communications.

Remote learning:

As of today, for all children who are not attending school they will have access to remote learning. It is expected that all children who are not in school are completing the learning set and sending their work into their child's class teacher. For pupils in EYFS, Years 1 and 2, all work should be uploaded to your child's Class Dojo Portfolio. A video link for how these can be created can be found <u>here</u>.

All pupils in Key Stage 2, are expected to 'turn in' their learning via Google Classroom. As with Key Stage 1, all lessons will come with an input from your child's class teacher.

What if my child does not have access to technology?

Towards the end of the Autumn Term, I asked all parents and carers to complete an access to technology questionnaire. This remains open and I ask those of you who did not complete it to do so: Access to technology

This will enable us to ensure your child continues to have access to learning.

What if we do not have resources at home?

Please ensure that any problems with accessing or completing home learning is communicated with the class teacher as soon as possible.

To ensure you have the resources that you need at home to support your child's learning, there is an opportunity to collect learning resources and exchange reading books each week.

This week, the resources will include work books, stationary and reading books. In addition to this, for those children in EYFS and Key Stage 1 there will be additional phonics and number resources. When collecting resources, be considerate of others by only taking one of each item. When returning reading books, please place these in the red returns box.
