Access to Technology:

Since the start of term, we have been able to provide a number of families with access to a Chrome Book. I am also aware that there are a number of families who prefer to complete the work in a paper form through collecting resources from the school.

Wellbeing:

Word Millionaires:

As you know, this year we have introduced Accelerated Reader across Key Stage 2. Each time a child reads a book, they complete a quiz. Depending on the quiz score the child receives, they will be allocated a percentage of the book's word count.

This week, Kitty C and Max C-L in Year 6, became the school's first word millionaires! In recognition of their enthusiasm for reading they will both receive a £10 book voucher. Across Key Stage 2, there are a number of pupils who have read over 500,000 words meaning they too are on track to be word millionaires by the end of the year.

Christian Value:


This half term, we have been exploring the value of **HOPE**. This half term, our Christian value is focused on the bible passage:
