Re-Opening of Schools

On Monday, the Government confirmed that all children will return to school on **Monday 8th March**.

Following the Government's announcement, we are looking forward to welcoming all pupils back to school on the 8th March. I would like to say a huge thank you to parents and carers for supporting your child's learning during these challenging times.


All of the measures that both yourself and your child were familiar with during the Autumn Term, will remain in place when all children return to school.

Staggered Starts and Finishes:

To ensure social distancing is observed, each year group's allocated drop off and pick up times will remain in place. To also maintain social distancing, the one-way system will also remain. Parents and children will enter the school from the Church Lane entrance (via the main car park) and leave via the Orchard Way exit.

In addition to this:

- we request that only one parent drops off or picks up their child(ren) to minimise the number of adults on the school grounds,
- when collecting your child(ren) please observe social distancing,
- each group has a designated entry and pick up point into the building,
- all play equipment remains out of bounds for all children at the beginning and end of the school day.

Wearing Masks on the School Site:

Supporting Your Child Returning to School:

For pupils in EYFS and Key Stage 1, you will be sent your child's username, password and Google Classroom code via Class Dojo. In addition to this, you can also view the school's returning to school video on the <u>website</u> and share the recommended books.

If you have any concerns regards your child's return to school, please contact myself, Mrs Bush or Mrs Greatorex through Class Dojo or by contacting the school office. Our aim is to ensure the transition between home and school is a positive one for all children.

We are aware that the return to school after such a challenging time will be difficult for some children; therefore, PSHE and our whole school text 'The boy, the mole, the fox and horse', will form part of the children's learning for first week.

On Friday 12th March, each class will have a virtual workshop with *Just Different*. During the interactive workshop, pupils will learn and about disability and differences.

From 15th March, pupils across the school will participate in disability sports in PE including Goal Ball, Boccia and New Age Kurling.
