

Outdoor Learning:

Over the past half term, I have been delighted with the way in which pupils have responded to our improved approach to Outdoor Learning. Over the past five weeks, pupils have engaged in our 'tools' unit. Pupils in Years 1 and 2 have developed their whittling skills, Years 3 and 4 have developed their drilling skills whilst yesterday, pupils in Year 5 developed their sawing skills in creating their own pendant.

In addition to learning how to use a range of tools, pupils have also deepened their understanding of knots and completed a range of pioneering activities:

'I enjoyed the outdoor learning because we did different activities to last time. There was a good mix of rope tying, sawing and drilling. Making the amulets was fun and we got to take them home!' (Charley C, Y5)

'I enjoyed doing the carrots because I really enjoy chopping sticks. It was a bit easier with carrots. The rabbits can come and eat the pieces that are left over - it's good to help nature' **(Zachary B, Y1)**



Next half term, our approach to Outdoor Learning moves to Outdoor Adventurous Activities (OAA). During May half term, we will be having an orienteering course installed on our school grounds. The purpose of OAA is to develop pupils' communication and problem-solving skills as well as improve their map reading skills.

Christian Value:

As part of our Christian Value of **REVERENCE**, we have been focusing on the importance of respecting others and what this means to the children of South Bersted Church of England Primary School.

Over the past two weeks, we have explored the moment that Jesus called Mathew and his response to the money collectors at the temple in Jerusalem. We have continued to explore what Luke 6:31, '*Do to others as you would have them do to you*' means to the children and their reflections:

'It means to treat people fairly and treat them how you want to be treated' (Poppy L, Y4)
