Reading:

This week, pupils in Years 2-6 have completed their half termly Accelerated Reader assessments. Based on this, you may find that your child's ZPD has changed and therefore the type of book that they are accessing has changed.

Please continue to support your child's reading by encouraging them to read at home. You may recall me stating the importance of children reading for 20 minutes a day. Research shows that if a child reads for 20 minutes a day it exposes them to 1, 800,000 words and increases their academic opportunities.

You may recall that in January, I wrote to you regards the <u>7 Top Tips for reading at home</u>. You can also use your child's <u>South Bersted Reading Bookmark</u> to ask age appropriate questions when your child is reading.

Outdoor Learning:

Yesterday, pupils in Year 1 enjoyed learning how to whittle, tie a figure of 8 knot and engaged in a pioneering challenge as part of our approach to Outdoor Learning.
