

COVID-19 Update:

This week, the Prime Minister announced the plans and expectations for the lifting of restrictions from Monday 19th July. As I am sure you are well aware, there is an increasing number of adults and children within the local area testing positive for COVID-19. With this in mind, we will be maintaining our approaches to bubbles and visitors until the end of term.

As you will have read yesterday, our plans for our whole school transition remain in place with pupils spending the day in their new classroom with their teacher for September and current teaching assistant.

A number of you have spoken to me regards our plans for September. I aim to write to you early next week to confirm all plans. I can confirm, that on their PE days, pupils should continue to arrive in their PE kits and the one-way system will remain in place for the start of term.

Power of a Team Day (Years 1 and 2):

As part of our PSHE curriculum, this week, pupils in Years 1 and 2 completed their Power of Team Day! Throughout the day, pupils completed a range of challenges which they needed their friends support to complete.... tasks that would have been impossible on their own.

In completing a sponsored event to raise funds to improve a local area, including the school grounds, one of the challenges was to run a marathon in a day! Children completed this task by running around the Golden Mile track. Collectively, the children ran an incredible 82 miles with some pupils running more than two miles (12 laps). During the day, the children demonstrated endurance and have certainly learnt about the power of a team.

Christian Values:


