## **Message from our Vice-Chair of Governors:**

As part of our approach at South Bersted Church of England Primary school, we want our children to take on a range of roles and responsibilities. This week during Collective Worship, we have been deepening our understanding of the British Value of Democracy. We explored the importance of everyone having a voice and how as a school, everyone is equal and has the right to share their views on how the school could be even better.

### **Outdoor Learning:**

This half term, the focus of our outdoor learning lessons is art. On Monday, pupils in Year 5 were set the challenge of creating a scene using natural materials that they would be in. They could not pick any materials or objects from trees, they could only use what they had found.

'I made a train that we could ride. The best part was making details with stick for the frame and
