Transatlantic	Crossing the Atlantic Ocean
Disaster	a sudden accident or a natural catastrophe that causes great damage or loss of life
Emigrants	People who leave their country to settle permanently in another
Titanic	A word from Greek mythology meaning 'gigantic'
Tempest	A violent windy storm; also a play by William Shakespeare
Crew	a group of people who work on and operate a ship, aircraft, etc.
Maiden voyage	The first voyage of a ship
Passenger liner	A ship primarily (mainly) used for transporting passengers
Maritime	A word meaning 'connected to the sea'
RMS	Royal Mail Ship – vessels which carry the Royal Mail

Key Facts and Figures:

2208	Number of people aboard the Titanic
1503	Number of passengers and crew who died in the disaster
White Star Line	Company which owned and operated RMS Titanic
Edward Smith	Captain of RMS Titanic, who died in the sinking
RMS Carpathia	Ship that rescued an estimated 705 passengers from the wreckage
RMS Titanic	a British passenger liner that sank in the North Atlantic Ocean on 15 April 1912, after striking an iceberg during her maiden voyage from Southampton to New York City.
RNLI	The Royal National Lifeboat Institution is the largest charity that saves lives at sea around the coasts established in 1824
British coastline	Approximately 19,491 miles (31,368 km).
William Shakespeare	English poet, playwright, and actor, widely regarded as the greatest writer in the English language in the world.

**Can you find where Bognor Regis is located on this map?****Red and yellow beach flag**

Lifeguarded area. Safest area to swim, bodyboard and use inflatables.

**Black and white chequered beach flag**

For surfboards, stand-up paddleboards, kayaks and other non-powered craft. Launch and recovery area for kitesurfers and windsurfers. Never swim or bodyboard here.

**Red beach flag**

Danger! Never go in the water under any circumstances when the red flag is flying.

**Orange windsock**

Indicates offshore or strong wind conditions. Never use inflatables when the windsock is flying.
