

Reading

What makes a good reader?

The main purpose of reading is to build a visual image of the text.



What is phonics?

A method of teaching people to read by correlating sounds with symbols in an alphabetic writing system.

Why do we teach phonics?

Phonics gives children a strategy to help them read and write words.

How do we teach phonics?

Phonics is taught in a systematic and synthetic way through a daily four-part phonics lesson.

Six Phases


Phase 1 - mainly pre school

Phases 2, 3 and 4 - Reception and Year 1

Phase 5 - Year 1

Phase 6 - Year 2


Initial sounds



Blending for reading

Segmenting for spelling

Remaining initial sounds




Sounds made from 2 letters

Middle vowel sounds - 2 letter digraphs or 3 letter trigraphs

Blending and Segmenting

No new sounds




Learn what vowels are and then ccvc and cvcc words

Focus on adjacent consonants

Focus on reading and writing longer words e.g. lunchbox

Remaining middle vowel sounds




Remaining sounds made from 2 or 3 letters (digraphs or trigraphs)

Split digraph sounds

Alternative pronunciation e.g. soft c or ie for pie and ie for chief.







KS1 Comprehension

- Give children 'Find It' questions and 'Prove It' questions.
- 'Find It' questions are literal questions what colour was the ball?
- •'Prove It' involves inference and deduction why was the boy sad?
- Develop understanding of 'causal inference'
- The girl standing beside the lady was wearing a red dress.

Q:What colour dress was the girl wearing?

 Katie took a drink out of her bag. The apple juice was cool and refreshing.


Q: What was Katie's drink?

- Model being a reader yourself!




