Easter Events

As we count down towards Easter, I wanted to write to you to inform you of a number of activities which will be taking place.

Religious Education:

As part of our approach to RE, we follow the Understanding Christianity scheme of work. During this week and next week, pupils across the school will be answering a range of Big Questions linked to Salvation.

Easter Eggs:

Easter Eggs, remind us of the importance of new life. On Wednesday and Thursday during the last week of term, children across the school will complete an orienteering course and answer key questions linked to the significance of Easter to Christians. On completion of the course, children will receive an Easter Egg which the Friends of South Bersted Church of England Primary School have kindly paid for.

The Flowering of the Cross:

One of our Easter traditions, is the flowering of the cross. We take our Christmas tree and cut it down to create a cross using the trunk of the tree. The cross is then covered with wire so children can decorate the cross with fresh flowers. The transformation of a barren cross reminds us of Jesus' death on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter Sunday.
