beach	<i>A pebbly or sandy shore</i>
cliff	<i>A steep rock face at the edge of the sea</i>
coasts	<i>Where the sea meets the land</i>
harbour	<i>A place on the cost where ships moor</i>
Island	<i>A piece of land surrounded by sea</i>
lighthouse	<i>A tower with a light to warn people of land out at sea</i>
ocean	<i>A large stretch of water</i>
pier	<i>A platform leading out from the shore to the sea</i>
promenade	<i>A paved, public walkway near to the sea front</i>
