

It has been wonderful to see the children returning to school with enthusiasm towards their learning and looking smart. I would also like to take this opportunity to welcome a number of new families to our school community.

The whole school started the term with a PSHE focus. Pupils across the school have completed work on identifying their emotions and developing a range of vocabulary associated to them, the emotions of others, trusted adults and how they can respond to a worry. Pupils have also explored the British Value of democracy and have voted for their class representatives for the year.

School Value:

This half term's Christian Value is Koinonia.

1 Corinthians 12 v 12 -31

'Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one'

Koinonia means 'that which is in common' and is often translated as 'fellowship' or 'community'. Other translations might include 'union', 'partnership', or 'being yoked together'. A yoke is a shaped piece of wood that goes across the shoulders, often linking two animals. By combining their strength, it helps work to be done and burdens to be carried.

As a school, every child and adult plays a valuable part in making South Bersted Church of England Primary School a fantastic place to learn. Over the coming week, we will take inspiration from Queen Elizabeth II and her dedication and service, by considering how we can be there for each other.

Trim Trail:

There has been much excitement across the school, as pupils have begun using the new trim trail. This has been funded through the <u>Sports Premium</u>.

Attendance and Punctuality:

At South Bersted Church of England Primary School, we want to work with parents and carers to improve our whole school attendance. Over the past two years, there have been many disruptions to pupils' learning due to the COVID–19 pandemic. We know that central to improving pupil's attainment and accelerating progress is their regular attendance at school.

An attendance of 96%+ is assessed as a good attendance. Often when we see a figure of **90%** we may interpret this as a good attendance; however, if your child has an attendance of **90%** across the school year, this represents **19** days they have been absent from school, which is just under 4 weeks they have not attended school for.

As stated in the school's <u>Attendance Policy</u>, I regularly review each child's attendance. Each half term letters are sent out for pupils that have an attendance below 95.9% to ensure early intervention in maintaining good levels of attendance across the school year.
