Across the school this week, we have focused on fundamental British Values with a key focus on Democracy. We began the week with pupils from Year 6 presenting about why they should be elected to the role of Junior Governor. After pupils had presented their speeches, staff and children from across the school went to the ballet boxes to cast their votes. Congratulations to Alice C, Ellie H, Jamie B and Bella L who were voted as this year's Junior Governors. Next Thursday, Bognor Regis' Town Mayor, Cllr John Barrett, will be visiting the school to present the Junior Governors and School Councillors with their badges.

On Thursday, Mrs Bush led our whole school Philosophy for Children worship linked to International Day for Democracy and the text 'The Fairest Queen of All.'

New Chair of Governors:

At the end of the last academic year, our Chair of Governors Mr Ron Robson left the Governing Body. We are pleased to confirm that Mr Jon Davis has now been appointed as our new Chair of Governors. Mr Davis has a lot of experience in finance and buildings and will be taking on additional roles within the Governing Body, including being a lead governor for Computing, Buildings/Health and Safety and Finance, and he will also be the link Governor for Year 6.

"I have a strong interest in children's education. I wanted to make a difference and I felt that by joining the Governing Body at South Bersted Primary school I could share my experience and knowledge. I have two teenage daughters of my own, and my wife also works in the school office so I already had some links with the school.

I run a small local business employing 30 people and am well used to finding solutions to problems and balancing financial resources together with employee health and wellbeing. I look forward to working more closely with Mr Goodwin and all the staff and I will be visiting school as regularly as I can. I recently met with the Ofsted Inspector to discuss the school's journey and found this to be a very valuable experience for me as a new Chair of Governors."

Parent Governor Vacancy:

We currently have a vacancy for a Parent Governor and we have sent out a letter this week with more details about this. The extract below from the National Governors Association highlights the importance of parents and carers being part of the Governing Body:

'The more involved the parents were in their children's school life (including volunteering in school, participating in Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) conferences, and teaching at home), the more positive the impact became on children's performance academically. [...] only a minority of parents in the United Kingdom are uninterested in their children's education. Instead, the majority may experience difficulty in expressing their interest, something which is identified and acknowledged by professionals." Strong links between school and home have a beneficial impact on school life. The wider benefits of parental participation also include building trust between parents and teachers, developing a shared school ethos and culture, gaining cultural understanding, raising aspiration, increasing parent financial contributions, improving staff retention, and increasing access to out of school activities, business and employers.'

Each week, 2 pupils are entered into their Class Red Book for displaying the school's Christian Value and for going above and beyond in their learning. Congratulations to:






Reading Recommendations:
