Over the past two weeks, there have been a number of parent workshops linked to national assessments for Year 1, Year 2 and Year 6 pupils.


Today, all presentations have been uploaded to each of the class pages. If you have any questions regards these presentations, please contact your child's class teacher.

Times Table Rock Stars:

Earth v Air:
