Year 5 v Year 6:

Parking:

In particular, please do not block driveways, park on the yellow zig-zag lines outside of school, or park where your vehicle may be obscuring the view for pedestrians and other road users. Also, a number of cars have been parking on the grass verges in Church Lane; this is causing considerable damage to the grass and is making the area very muddy.

Reminder – Booking Hot Lunches:

We must remind all parents and carers of the importance of ensuring child's lunches are ordered by the deadline (orders close on the Thursday, 10 days before the meals are required).

If you do not order a hot lunch, you must make sure your child brings a packed lunch. We cannot guarantee there will be enough food to cover any child who does not have a lunch ordered – the kitchen is supplied with the number of meals required per day and this data is taken directly from the ParentPay ordering system.
