This week we have been learning about our mental health. In worship, children have been thinking about the theme of 'Let's Connect' and have been completing different activities that show their connections with other children in the school, learning that we all have connections with others and these can help us when our emotions are too big!



To help deepen pupil's understanding of this, each child has created their own hand print, written their interests on them and has then connected their print to another child's hand and displayed them in the school hall.

In classes, children have been learning about how adrenaline works, giving us our fight, flight, freeze response; how worries aren't always bad and can keep us safe and also learning about how to manage problems.

'We looked at worries and what we can do if we have a worry. It is important that we share our worries so others can help us' (Angel J, Y5)

'We drew portraits, and our friends wrote our 'gifts' and strengths around the outside' (Francesca W, Y4)

We learnt the importance of friendship and what makes a good friend. A good friend always looks out for you and you have the same interests' (Evie H and Bella-Rose H, Y4)

Christian Value:

During today's Collective Worship, we reflected on our half termly value of HOPE:

'May the God of Hope fill you with all the joy and peace and trust in him so that you overflow with hope by the Power of the Holy Spirit.'

This half term's worships have focused on the importance of having hope during challenging times and the hope we can have in God. We have also explored the importance that hope is not just about crossing our fingers, but taking action. Within our indoor prayer space, pupils were given the opportunity to write prayers on their hopes for the future.

It is wonderful that pupils received their own copy of one of Candy's books and they had the opportunity to have these signed by her.


'It was great to get a new book from an author! I've loved reading it and have read it four times already!'


