Year 4 PSHE / Parent and Carer Information Meeting

As a part of your child's education at South Bersted Primary School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives children the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

Following a Parent Consultation during the Autumn Term of 2020, we have been following our new PSHE frame of work. It was agreed during the Parent Consultation that the more sensitive parts of the Relationships Education would be taught as a blocked unit alongside Sex Education and that parent workshops would be offered prior to teaching.

Objectives that will be covered during this blocked unit are as follows (objectives underlined can be withdrawn from):

Year 4:	Growing and Changing, <u>What is Puberty? Puberty Changes and Reproduction;</u> Positive relationships – exploring relationships that make us happy and what to do if a relationship makes us sad; Unacceptable physical contact – revisit the Pants rule from Year 2
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Blocked teaching of the RSE unit will start from Monday 20th March 2023. **Prior to this, you are invited to take part in a parent and carer information meeting.**

The meeting will take place on **Thursday 16th March at 9.00am**, in the school hall. Please confirm your attendance to the school office via Class Dojo.



The aim of the parent and carer information meeting is:

- *To review the curriculum for your child's year group,*
- *To review the resources used,*
- *To understand the withdrawal process.*

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. All PSHE and RSE teaching takes place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values.
