## CHRISTIAN VALUES

This half term, Collective Worship focuses on the value of Justice.

When thinking about 'justice', some people think first about giving wrongdoers the punishment they deserve. 'Justice' evokes ideas of 'just deserts', 'the punishment fitting the crime', 'an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth'. However, that would be a one-sided picture of justice. Justice also means giving all people - particularly the poor and oppressed - what is right and fair for them to have: life, health, freedom and dignity. It is about acting out of a concern for what is right and seeing right prevail. It is about social justice.

This week, we have considered the importance of rules and laws in ensuring that people are treated equally and fairly. We have also explored fairness. Pupils have reflected on what is fair and have begun to consider fairness beyond themselves.

Attached to this week's newsletter is an activity sheet where you can explore the value of Justice further.

At the end of the last half, pupils shared their reflections on Reverence as part of our Head, Heart and Feet approach. A copy of their responses can be found attached to this week's newsletter.



Yesterday, pupils across the school engaged in an afternoon of art linked to our whole school values. The children worked with a secondary teacher from Felpham Community College to create a whole school art installation. Over the coming weeks, we look forward to completing the art project.
