AUTHOR VISIT:

On the 18th September, we welcome author David Fuller to the school. David is the author of the popular Alfie Jones series which currently comprises seven books, and has recently spawned a spin-off - Chloe of the Comets - which was published earlier this year. The series has been praised by teachers, children and critics.

Additionally, he is also the author of the Galactic Towers series which consists of two books at the moment, with a third due to be released later this year.

During his sessions, David discusses memories of his own reading and writing experiences from his school days (he has slight dyspraxia so found writing fairly difficult; but loved literacy), and his journey to eventually becoming an author. He also talks about his books and explains why (and how) he has decided to write the types of books that he has. The last 10 minutes or so of the session are set aside for the children to ask him questions.
