## **COURAGEOUS ADVOCACY:**

This week, our Year 6 pupils were visited by representatives from Southern Water in response to the letters they wrote at the end of Year 5. They were talked through a presentation of how the water treatment process works and what causes the storm overflows to release into the ocean, as well as how Southern Water plan to further reduce the number of cases of this happening. The children were shown a diorama that demonstrated how neighbourhoods can become more 'water friendly' in supporting the storage and drainage of water.


## **MENTAL HEALTH DAY HOME LEARNING:**



## MCAS APP:

If you have not yet created your MCAS account please can I ask that you do this as soon as possible as this is the way in which we now send all communication to parents and carers.

To create your account, you will need to download the free MCAS app (search MCAS in your app store) and when prompted to log in select 'Forgotten Password'. You will then be guided through adding your email address and creating a password for your new account. Please be aware that the email address you use in this app will need to be the same one that we have on our records. If you need any assistance with this please speak to the office.

<u>Please note that you must select 'allow notifications' in your phone app settings for MCAS otherwise</u> you will not receive our communications.

If you have already created your MCAS account you will still need check your phone settings to ensure notifications are allowed for the app.

If you do all of the above and still are not receiving our communications please delete the app and reinstall it, ensuring notifications for it are turned as this seems to be correcting the issue for some parents.
