
# NEWSLETTER SOUTH BERSTED C.E.




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
### **READING:**

### WHOLE SCHOOL CHALLENGE:

Our Home Learning Challenge is linked to our current school value of HOPE.

There are two challenges that you can choose from:

### **Challenge 1: Spiral of Hope**

### Spiral of Hope

Start with a circle of paper or light card and draw a spiral.

On the spiral write a **hope** or dream that you have that will make the world a safer, cleaner or more healthy place to live. Cut along the lines until you get to the centre, leaving a circle in the middle. Make a hole in the middle so you can hang your spiral from a thread.

(You may want to practice drawing a good spiral on some scrap paper before you start.)

### **Challenge 2: Hopes and Dreams Catcher**

Dream catchers are traditionally made from a looped willow branch onto which a net or web is woven. The net is then decorated with feathers, beads and other decorations.



Find a long twig that can be bent and tied to make a hoop or frame. Use natural string or thread stretched across the frame to make the net and then decorate it creatively to catch all the hopes and dreams you can!
