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ATTENDANCE:


This term's school attendance was 94.6%, which is 1.4% below our target.


Congratulations to Year 4, who have the highest attendance across the school.

EYFS- I show friendship by helping my friends and playing with them.

EYFS- Being kind to people, using kind hands.

Y1 - You should be honest and truthful.

Y1 - Helping others when they're hurt because friendship is helping others.

Y1 - When someone is on the floor and no one is helping them they feel sad. You don't need to leave them lying on the floor, you should help them up.

Y2 - You should help people and be kind to them

Y2 - Celebrate other people's success by listening to them

- Y2 If someone is on the friendship bench and they have no one to play with you can go over there and say 'Is everything ok?'
- Y2 I think it is very good that we have learnt about friendship because we need people to be
- Y3 It made me think about if someone falls, if they are alone they don't have anyone to help them. If someone fell over in football with others they can help you up.
 - Y3 If someone is bad, don't be bad back. That is revenge and it's not a nice thing.
 - Y3 2 against 1 isn't fair. A person on their own needs someone else to help them.
 - Y4 If you get bumped over, be forgiving as maybe it was an accident.

Y4 - Be ready to play with others and share. Help people up.

Y5: I think friendship is when you should show empathy towards people. I think we shouldn't leave people on the floor we should help them up.

Yr 6: if you have a best friend, they will stick with you forever.

Yr 6: sometimes friends can come and go but it is worth making good friends so you don't have go through things on your own.

EYFS- I feel happy when people are kind to me and I have friends.

EYFS- If you didn't have friends you would feel sad, so you should ask them what friend they would like to have or who they would like to play with to cheer them up.

EYFS- I love it when people share toys with me, that is a kind friend.

- Y1 If someone passes the ball to you in basketball you feel happy and want to pass it to another person.
- Y1 When someone shared a toy with me it made me feel happy so I was kind back to them.
 - Y1 You should take turns to play with someone so everyone gets to play with it so that everyone gets a turn and nobody feels sad when they don't get it.
- Y1 If someone makes you happy and they then fall over at lunch I want to make them happy.

 Y2 Helping people and making them happy makes them trust you more
 - Y2 When I shared something I had done out of school I was happy because everyone celebrated something that I really like
- Y2 When you have success it makes you feel good and when you share it with others it makes you happy
 - Y3 People help other people when they are hurt, when I see that my heart is happy.
 - Y3 The Good Samaritan, that's how i think and feel about friendship and it helps me to not forget it.
 - Y3 I feel that all of the bad things that we've done we can make up for it.
 - Y4 If someone is alone at break time I know to see if I can play with them.

Y4 - If someone is sad I try to make them happy.

Y5: I know that everyone has friends no matter what.

Y5: I think the best way to help someone is to ask 'Is everything okay?'

Year 6: gives me a better understanding of how to be a friend and what it makes others feel.

Year 6: no friend can ever be perfect but that in itself makes them perfect.

EYFS- I could help my friends in phonics if they do not know the sound that we are learning.

EYFS- I will cheer my friends up if they are sad.

Y1 - If I see someone on their own I'm going to ask them if they want to play with me.

Y1 - I will help someone if they don't know what they're doing.

Y1 - If people fall down I'm going to help them up.

Y1 - I will use kind words and be a good friend.

Y2 - I'm going to try harder to be kind to people

Y2 - I will be more helpful and show others what being helpful means

Y2 - I will do things at home so mummy and daddy can have a rest

Y3 - I'm going to help people and tell a teacher to make sure that they are ok.

Y3 - If I see someone who is unhappy, you can't always see the bruise inside. I would ask "Are you ok?"

Y3 - I would be the person to help someone who was alone.

Y3 - One small deed makes a difference. Help them up, smile, a kind word, these are friendly things to do.

Y4 - When someone's unhappy, ask if they want to play with you.

Y4 - Talk to people nicely in class. Try and get on with whoever is sat next to me in the classroom even if it's not my best friend.

Y5: I have been listening and showing the person that I'm interested in what they say.

Y5: I have stepped into other people's shoes and tried to cheer people up.

Y5: I have made sure people have someone to play with at break times so they don't feel left out.

Y 6: be more conscious of friends' feelings so we don't fall out as much.

Y 6: I will make sure to use our new question - "Is everything okay?" as it is non-judgemental
